CCRG 2025



When Tom and I went to CCRG in Visalia, there were many tours to choose from to attend. We decided to take the Rosa Brothers Dairy and Creamery tour. The club arranged for us to take a leisurely drive from Visalia to Hanford (20 miles) through the country side before arriving at the Rosa Brothers Dairy. The dairy was started in 1953. It is currently being run by the third generation (2 brothers) and their families. The dairy has approximately 1000 Holstein cows that are milked twice a day. The dairy grows all the crops needed to feed the cows and the manure is distributed as fertilizer on fields near the dairy for growing hay and greens that feed the cows.

We first watched two videos about the dairy and then we took an adventure around the farm in the Moo-Mobile (a tour bus) to see the sights and sounds of a working dairy farm. Upon returning to the visitor center we got the opportunity to meet a live calf (who enjoyed chewing on my sweater).

From the dairy we drove 26 miles to Tulare where the Rosa Brothers Creamery/Retail Outlet is located. We were able to watch the bottle processing and ice cream making through a large window near the back of the store. Rosa Brothers is a dairy that still uses glass bottles for their milk products. We were welcome to enjoy free samples of milk and ice cream. It is also a retail store that sells their milk, ice cream, flavored milk and coffee creamer.


Instead of lunch, members will be asked to bring an appetizer to share (we will be munching during the auction). Bring your drink.
